ITEM 1- General Inquiry Questions and Answers:

- 1. There's no pricing document in RFQ documents, will one be provided? No. Respondents are to provide a fee schedule and a list of the services the respondent would perform by address with a total cost per address.
- 2. Please define a Tier II Environmental Clearance (located on 2nd page of Scope of Work).

Please refer to Attachment 1. Successful bidders will be supplied with Tier I submittals prepared by the City of Flint and requested to complete the table under **Compliance with 24 CFR 50.4, 58.5, and 58.6 Laws and Authorities,** and a field inspection. Consultant may be asked to provide guidance on additional items noted as being completed "during Tier II environmental review."

- **3.** Will hazardous waste types, quantities, and characteristics be provided? All material that has been produced is provided on the link to Box.com. Respondents should plan to typify, quantify, and characterize hazardous wastes as necessary/ incorporate such tasks into demolition bid specifications as necessary.
- 4. The proposed fees for professional services account for 50% of the selection criteria. The actual fees for professional services will be highly dependent on the quality of the selected demolition contractor, the scope of work required at each site and the length of time it takes for the contractor to complete the work. As the proposed fees for professional services from each of the RFQ respondents will be highly variable due to their assumptions used in fee preparation, how will the fees be compared?

It is anticipated that the successful bidder will be involved in the bidding and selection process for the demolition contractor. Fees may be compared with several methods, including total proposed cost by project address, staffing fees, and cost for report production. Proposed scopes will be considered and clarification requested where necessary in order to allow for cost comparison.



5. Should we assume complete removal of all structures, foundations, footings and slab at each site?

Yes. Each project will consist of 100% removal.

6. Will all paved surfaces such as parking lots, driveways, and internal sidewalks be removed or left in place?

All paved surfaces are to be removed per City Ordinance. Additionally, approaches are to be removed and replaced with curb.
