
From our aggressive demolition efforts, to the herd of goats we brought to Flint this year to help battle invasive buckthorn, we've accomplished a lot.

The Year of the GOAT



2025 was the year of the goat. Thanks to a grant from the Saginaw Bay Watershed Initiative Network, 48 goats (and 1 sheep) reported for duty in Flint this summer to devour invasive buckthorn in a sustainable way. The herd made an incredible impact on Stone Street in the area around Ramona Park.

"I like the fact that the goats are there," said neighbor Elaine Tipton. "If you used chemicals, it would harm us all. So, the Land Bank is helping us, making it a better environment."

Did you know? Goats are the only animals on Earth that can digest buckthorn.

Clean & Green is growing

The Clean & Green program remains one of the Land Bank's most impactful community partnerships. You help make it happen. This year, 68 community-based groups maintained nearly 30,000 lots in the city of Flint and interacted with approximately 750 neighbors. We are so proud and so grateful.

Clean & Green groups also reported thousands of illegal dumping sites, enabling Land Bank crews to clean and prevent more dumping.

Thanks to Clean & Green:


72% of neighbors spend more time outside
84% say the neighborhood feels safer
99% say the neighborhood looks better



Research by UM and the Youth Violence Prevention Center found 40% fewer violent crimes overall in Clean & Green areas.

More Demos Down

Demolitions are an essential part of the work we do and this year we took down 675 additional blighted structures. Total AARP and matched funding for blight elimination exceeds \$57 million dollars, with more than \$1M leveraged this year alone. Since the first of these demos was completed in 2023, 1,446 of the 1960 ARPA and match funded demos we're completed by the end of the fiscal year.



The Land Bank has demolished 9,940 structures across Flint and Genesee County since 2004.

As of October 2025, this year's demo numbers are:

1,960 demolitions funded
1,449 structures demolished

The Gatehouse Opens

The Gatehouse, our modular mixed-income condominium development in Flint was completed this year.



Located on W. 5th Avenue, the project features 16 two story row homes to help revitalize the neighborhood and address the community's need for workforce housing.

Unveiling "The Yard"

In October, we held the grand opening of The Yard, Flint's new central hub for Land Bank maintenance crews. The facility is located on the 3.5 acre site of the former James Lumber.

the Land Bank cleared it up and fully restored the property, investing \$1.9M.

The Yard will save the Land Bank in the long run by eliminating costly monthly rental payments, expanding our in-house capacity, and employing a local workforce.
